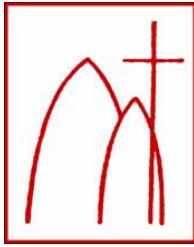

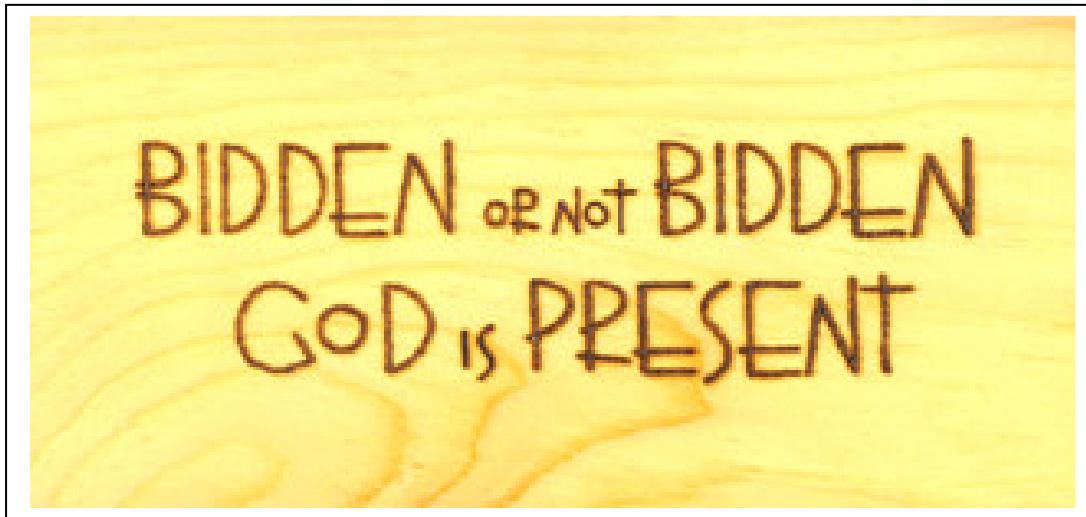

WELCOME!

Please leave this booklet in the church – Thanks!

Each person walks a unique path with God. If your path has led you here please know that whoever you are or wherever you are on the journey of faith **you are welcome here**. Make yourself at home. **If you would like to know more about us, our Core Value Statement is posted in the narthex (lobby) of the church, or speak to any member of the community.** If you have any questions one of the people who greeted you as you entered the church will be glad to help.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED DURING THIS SERVICE

This booklet, contains all the parts of the service in order. The blue hymn book (Common Praise) contains the hymns and music unless otherwise indicated in the Sunday hand out.

Make yourself at home. One of our themes in worship is “the stranger making themselves at home”, so please do just that. Sit where you are most comfortable, and for those who find hard pews difficult, there are free standing chairs in the gathering space at the back of the church.



If mobility is an issue for you, please do not worry. The gathering space at the back of the church provides plenty of room for walkers or wheel chairs.

There are also spaces for both at the front of the church at the head of both side aisles. **The communion rail is accessible for those using walkers, wheelchairs or scooters. But, if mobility is a concern for you, let one of the greeters know and we will be glad to bring communion to you at your seat.**



The Presiding Celebrant and homilist (preacher) are “wired for sound”. If you have any difficulty hearing the service, let one of the greeters know and we will do what we can to correct this.



An accessible washroom is located on the ground floor of the Parish House. Go through the door to the right at the front of the church (past the font) and turn left, the washroom is at the back of the Parish House lobby.

ABOUT THE LITURGY

LANGUAGE

We recognize that at various times in history people have understood and related to God in different ways. These have been reflected in the images and language of

worship. We receive these expressions as a reflection of the heritage of faith received by the community. In our own time, some find that other images of God are meaningful as found in contemporary translations and inclusive language. We receive these as a witness of faith added to our heritage so that we can pass this witness on to future generations.

We welcome all these, together with more personal and familial expressions; our goal is to enrich, not replace, the living tradition of Christian prayer. Our services may reflect either, or both of these traditions respecting the various ways in which people express their experience of God.

STYLE

Our worship life is both varied and lively. While retaining the dignity and much of the historical character of Anglican liturgy, the community has developed a style that is open to experimentation and new and meaningful expressions of our faith that provide opportunities to celebrate with joy the great moments of life. All the Eucharistic liturgies at Bishop Cronyn Memorial use the Book of Alternative Services Contemporary forms with some additions and variations as suits the season or occasion.

THE GATHERING OF THE COMMUNITY



HYMN # 1 on the hymn board

Presider: The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

People: **And also with you**

Presider: Blessed be God in Christ Jesus, our yesterday, our today and our tomorrow.

People: **May the Spirit give us voice to sing God's praise.**

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Leader: Together, let us pray

(A brief time of **silence is kept**, then all pray together the Collect of the day listed below)

June 6 O God, from whom all good proceeds: Grant that by your inspiration we may think those things that are right, and by your merciful guiding may do them; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

June 13 Keep, O Lord, your household the Church in your steadfast faith and love, that through your grace we may proclaim your truth with boldness, and minister your justice with compassion; for the sake of our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

June 20 O Lord, make us have perpetual love and reverence for your holy Name, for you never fail to help and govern those whom you have set upon the sure foundation of your loving kindness; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

June 27 Almighty God, you have built your Church upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief cornerstone: Grant us so to be joined together in unity of spirit by their teaching, that we may be made a holy temple acceptable to you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

July 4 O God, you have taught us to keep all your commandments by loving you and our neighbor: Grant us the grace of your Holy Spirit, that we may be devoted to you with our whole heart, and united to one another with pure affection; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

July 11 O Lord, mercifully receive the prayers of your people who call upon you, and grant that they may know and understand what things they ought to do, and also may have grace and power faithfully to accomplish them; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

July 18 Almighty God, the fountain of all wisdom, you know our necessities before we ask and our ignorance in asking: Have compassion on our weakness, and mercifully give us those things which for our unworthiness we dare not, and for our blindness we cannot ask; through the worthiness of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

July 25 O God, the protector of all who trust in you, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: Increase and multiply upon us your mercy; that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may so pass through things temporal, that we lose not the things eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Aug 1 Let your continual mercy, O Lord, cleanse and defend your Church; and, because it cannot continue in safety without your help, protect and govern it always by your goodness; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Aug 8 Grant to us, Lord, we pray, the spirit to think and do always those things that are right, that we, who cannot exist without you, may by you be enabled to live according to your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Aug 15 Almighty God, you have given your only Son to be for us a sacrifice for sin, and also an example of godly life: Give us grace to receive thankfully the fruits of his redeeming work, and to follow daily in the blessed steps of his most holy life; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Aug 22 Grant, O merciful God, that your Church, being gathered together in unity by your Holy Spirit, may show forth your power among all peoples, to the glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Aug 29 Lord of all power and might, the author and giver of all good things: Graft in our hearts the love of your Name; increase in us true religion; nourish us with all goodness; and bring forth in us the fruit of good works; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen.

Sept 5 Almighty God, you have so linked our lives one with another that all we do affects, for good or ill, all other lives: So guide us in the work we do, that we may do it not for self alone, but for the common good; and, as we seek a proper return for our own labor, make us mindful of the rightful aspirations of

other workers, and arouse our concern for those who are out of work; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
